2022 Key stage 1 Results

For the children who achieved the expected score in reading, writing and maths combined, our result was 68%-compared to 53% nationally (**significantly above average**). 7% of children achieved the greater depth score in reading, writing and maths combined, above the national average of 6%.

2022 Y1 Phonics results

81% of children achieved the pass mark for the phonics test (32 out of 40), therefore reaching the standard expected for phonics. This was above the 2022 national average of 75%.

2022 Year 2 Phonics Results

In the Autumn term, 86% of children achieved the pass mark for the phonics test (32 out of 40), therefore reaching the standard expected for phonics.

In June 2022, 4 children re-took the phonics test, with 1 achieving the threshold mark.

This means 89% of children reached the expected threshold for phonics by the end of Year 2, which is just below the 2019 national average of 92%.

2022 EYFS Results

70% of children scored 2 or 3 on their profile, for the 12 areas counting towards the 'good learning development'. (This was 65% nationally in 2022).

77% of children achieved in the prime areas (74% nationally), <u>andthe average points total for all of</u> the children was 32.4, also above the national average of 31.0.

Children had to score 2 (expected progress) or 3 (exceeded progress) for each of the 12 areas of learning.

The children are **above** the national average for speaking and listening, emotional development, writing, shape, space and measure, understanding the world, being imaginative and exploring and using media and materials.

YEAR 4 Multiplication Tables Check

The average score for the class, out of 25 marks, was 17.6.

12 out of 26 children scored 20 or more out of 25.

KEY STAGE 2

Standards of attainment at the end of KS2 are in line and above national average. This represents good progress given the children's ability on entry and their attainment at the end of Key Stage 1.

NOTES

The children have achieved so well due to their commitment to learning in school, homework and revision, and have been supported by their families to achieve. Fundamentally, very good teaching and support has been provided by the Year 6 team, and they have had good teaching throughout their years at school.

The children also reached 95% attendance for both 20/21 and 21/22, which has minimalised the disruption to their learning. The measures we have had in place to limit disruption and infection have paid off with these results, including covering staff absence effectively.
